## LUTSF 30th anniversary film 'CROSSING FRONTIERS' at the BOLD Festival, Australia

Organised, directed and curated by the performer and choreographer, Liz Lea, the BOLD Festival is a biannual event in Canberra offering an extensive programme of talks, film screenings and performances celebrating the legacy and heritage of dance in Australia and elsewhere. The Festival this March 2019 ran over five days and featured a range of international artists.

Liz Lea's project took her across India following in the footsteps of early dance pioneers, Anna Pavlova and Ruth St Denis. A recent documentary repeat of that journey has been captured on film and news of LUTSF 30th anniversary film, 'Crossing Frontiers', prompted Liz Lea to request the screening of both films at the Festival. Our thanks to Liz Lea for honouring her award and offering the opportunity to promote the Fund to an international audience.

LUTSF is delighted and grateful to announce the receipt of a substantial bequest from the Estate of our former President, Dr. Geraldine Stephenson. The first Chair of the Fund in 1987, and President until her death in December 2017, Dr. Stephenson was an eminent dance teacher and choreographer for film and television.



This visit to the USA to shadow Liz Lerman and observe at the Julliard School allowed me to learn about reflective and educational models that have undoubtedly impacted on my pedagogical decision-making. I have engaged with numerous projects since, and devised Kerry Nicholls Dance's (KND's) curriculum fusing my commitment to artistic professional training and working

within holistic settings. The opportunity supported by LUTSF empowered me to make shifts in my thinking and practice, which propelled the deep rethinking of spaces for joint deliberation, experience and imagination, kerrynicholls.com

It is extraordinary to reflect on the fact that some nineteen years have now passed since this momentous trip. I was, at the time, deeply involved in composing a new score, commissioned by the Verona Ballet Company, for a family-friendly ballet based on the story of the Ramayana. Since then, I have continued my deep involvement in the world of dance, composing for companies and projects in Portugal, Mexico, South Africa, Slovenia, Cambodia, Italy, Germany, Scotland, England and Palestine.



## Anita Clark, 2004/2005, Boston and Rhode Island, USA

The experience of participating in the Community/ Performance conference helped me to consider my work from an international perspective, and also opened me up to many different approaches to dance and performance making. In 2016, I was appointed as Director of The Work Room in Glasgow. My working practice is rooted in a belief that dance has the potential to be at the forefront of social change. Being supported to travel to this conference by LUTSF gave me the opportunity to reflect on my dance experience and encouraged me to embrace more fully the radical within performance making. theworkroom.org.uk
